- 5- Honor and integrity
- 6- Respect for others

 The essence of professionalism. The best interest of the patients, not selfinterest, is the rule.



ACCOUNTABILITY

- Required at many levels
 - individual patients, society and the profession.



EXCELLENCE التميز

 Entails a conscientious effort to exceed normal expectations and make a commitment to life-long learning.

- ABIM, (2001) describes unprofessional behaviour in terms of seven broad categories of 'signs and symptoms':
- I. Abuse of power
- 2. Arrogance
- 3. Greed
- 4. Misrepresentation
- 5. Impairment
- 6. Lack of conscientiousness
- 7. Conflicts in interests

- 1. Abuse of power abuse with patients (abuse while interacting with patients and colleagues; bias and sexual harassment; and breach of confidentiality).
- 2. Arrogance الغطرسة (offensive display of superiority and self-importance).
- 3. Greed الجشع (when money becomes the driving force).

4. Misrepresentation الأحتيال (lying, which is consciously failing to tell the truth; and fraud, which is conscious misrepresentation of material fact with the intent to mislead).

5. Impairment الضعف (any disability that may prevent the physician from discharging his/her duties).

- 6. Lack of conscientiousness انعدام (failure to fulfill responsibilities).
- (self-promotion/ advertising or unethical collaboration with industry; acceptance of gifts; and misuse of services overcharging, inappropriate treatment or prolonging contact with patients).



Some learn from role models


How can We Teach Professionalism?
