investigation

Urine test show elevated in bacteria and pus and blood test shows increase in WBC number

What are the differential diagnoses?

- 1- Cystitis usually
- 2- Urethritis

3 microorganism could cause the diseases?

- 1- E.coli most common
- 2- Enterococcus facials
- 3- candida

How can to treat the patient?

- 1- Ciprofloxacin for gram –ve
- 2- Nitrofurantoin most effective

What are the nerve and blood supply of bladder?

Internal iliac artery

S2,3,4 and L1,2

Why female more affected than male by UTI?

Due to short urethra and genetic

Some risk factor can cause the diseases

- 1-infection of prostate
- 2-pegncncy
- 3-stons

How to diagnose?

- 1- Suprapubic aspiration or catheterization
- 2- Microscopic examination
