Topic: History taking & examination of the Respiratory system

Objectives:

By the end of the session, the student should be able to:

- 1. Ability to obtain a complete and accurate medical respiratory history
- 2. To perform a general and respiratory system focused physical examination.
- 3. Construct a plausible differential diagnosis for common respiratory presentations.
- 4. Interpret the most useful clinical laboratory and radiological investigations in respiratory medicine.
- 5. Formulate a reasonable appropriate management plan covering common respiratory conditions both acute and chronic.

Key Outlines:

- 1. The cardinal symptoms and signs of respiratory pathology.
- 2. Respiratory inspection is always a dynamic process, which starts while seeing the patient.
- 3. Physical examination must be in a classic sequence. (Inspection, Palpation, Percussion and Auscultation)

Take home message:

- 1. Clinical examination of respiratory system is comparative in nature.
- 2. Bedside examination must be correlated with images, ABG and PFT.
