

KNOWLEDGE

- Phenomenological psychopathology (signs and symptoms) of psychiatric disorders.
- Classification and etiology in clinical psychiatry (bio-psychosocial).
- Common psychiatric disorders:
 - Clinical features and course.
 - Epidemiology and etiology.
 - Differential diagnosis.
 - Treatment (bio-psycho-social) and prognosis.
- Treatment modalities in psychiatry:
 - Physical: pharmacotherapy, electroconvulsive therapy
 - Psychological: behavioral, cognitive, supportive psychotherapy and others.

SKILLS

 - Proper interview techniques and skills.

462 COURSE OVERVIEW

The course lasts for 5 weeks (3 days each) and contains

- 1. Cognitive Disorders Theme
- 2. Psychotic Disorders Theme
- 3. Mood Disorders Theme
- 4. Anxiety Disorders Theme
- 5. Child Psychiatry Theme
- Clinical Activities (in-patient, outpatient, consultation-liaison, child psychiatry) include clinical cases log with a help of an assigned supervisor.

CASE-BASED LECTURE

- 3 lectures of 3 important topics were taken at 2nd year in CNS block.
- In 462 course, we will follow the manual...case then some theory..then another piece of the case..etc.
- You need to prepare in advance for the Case-based lectures.
- The tutors will focus on important clinical issues.
- You need to read all the topics related to the theme from the recommended textbook. You can ask about difficult issues at anytime.

CLINICAL ACTIVITIES (Out-patient Clinics and Ward Round Attendance)

- 1) You will be divided into 6 groups & during each clinical session:
 - A) 3 out of the 6 groups will be assigned to attend 3 different general, consultation liaison or child clinical psychiatry activities.
 - B) 3 out of the 6 groups will have Video session.
- 2) Each student should log all clinical cases (minimum is one case per clinical session) that they see while joining different clinical teams.
