


## Circulation & Hemorrhage Control

- Assessment
  - LOC, Skin, Pulse
- Bleeding
  - Bleeding control, replacement (IVF/Blood)

#### GCS

E<sub>4</sub>V<sub>5</sub>M<sub>6</sub>



#### **GSC**

- E<sub>4</sub>
  - Opens spontaneously = 4
  - To sound= 3
  - To pressure = 2
  - -None = 1



#### GSC

- V<sub>5</sub>
  - Oriented = 5
  - Confused = 4
  - Words = 3
  - Sounds = 2
  - -None = 1



#### **GSC**

- M<sub>6</sub>
  - Obeys commands = 6
  - Localizing = 5
  - Normal flexion = 4
  - Abnormal flexion= 3
  - Extension = 2
  - -None = 1




Figure 10-10 Decorticate (A) and decerebrate (B) posturing.





#### GCS

- Best Score = 15
- Worst Score = 3
- GCS ≤ 8 = Intubate

- Vent Rate, Capnography, ABG
- Log roll
